

You must be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen to receive a non-resident tuition waiver. Non-eligible citizens should visit <u>www.osuit.edu/admissions/international</u>)

Effective Fall 2019, all students classified as domestic out-of-state are eligible to be considered for a **full waiver of out-of-state fees**.

Out-of-state students taking 12 or more hours are required to live in the dorms for the duration of their college program(s) **unless they meet one of the exceptions listed below at the time the admissions application is submitted**:

- are 21 or older, or
- are married, or
- have a child

An exemption from housing does not provide an automatic approval of the nonresident tuition waiver for students otherwise required to live on campus.

The waiver will be revoked if: (1) the student does not meet one of the exceptions, or (2) the student moved off campus before the degree(s) were completed, or (3) the student does not maintain <u>Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP</u>)

Satisfactory Academic Progress requires the student to:

- 1. Maintain a minimum cumulative graduation/retention grade point average of:
 - a. (1.7) on a 4.0 scale for total hours earned from all institutions for 1 30 credit hours
 - b. OR 2.0 on a 4.0 scale for all programs EXCEPT Information Technology Division (ITD) and Engineering Technology Division (ETD) with total hours earned for 31 or more credit hours; 2.5 on a 4.0 scale for all Information Technology Division (ITD) and Engineering Technology Division (ETD) with total hours earned for 31 or more credit hours
- 2. Successfully complete at least 67% of all credit hours attempted (PACE). Hours passed divided by hours attempted determine pace percentage.
