GRADUATION SURVEY REPORT 2023-2024

This report focuses on results from students graduating during academic year 2023-2024 (summer semester 2023 through spring semester 2024). The Graduation Survey is a self-report instrument for graduating students to update their forwarding contact information before they leave Oklahoma State University Institute of Technology. Once graduating students complete the contact and employment information, the survey continues with scales for rating satisfaction with academic and non-academic services and giving graduates the opportunity to provide feedback on their educational experiences. Administrators of each academic school receive contact information and employment data, while satisfaction scale ratings remain in the Office of Institutional Research for analysis, aggregation, for the current report.

NOTE The 2023-2024 survey was substantially modified in question distribution and format and with multiple questions being updated or excluded. These changes were made to improve response rates and increase response authenticity. Some changes were for testing purposes, but most will remain in place.

The academic support specialists and career advisors in each academic school remind graduating students to complete the Graduation Survey prior to graduation. The OSUIT Office of Institutional Research prefers administration during the month of school. Because of OSUIT's graduation schedule, administration of the Graduation Survey occurs continuously throughout the year as students prepare to graduate.

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Degree Completion Data

A total of 771 students earned 814 degrees (see tables 1 and 2) between summer 2023 and spring 2024; of these, 43 graduated with two degrees. The Office of Institutional Research received 589 survey submissions completed or partially completed, but 35 of those submissions were completed by students who did not complete graduation requirements. Therefore, those responses were excluded from this report.

With 554 viable surveys there was a **68.06 percent response rate** based on the number of degrees awarded and a **67.83 percent response rate** based on student count. This is an **impressive increase of 26.76 percent** from the 2023 Graduation Survey response rate. Much of this improvement can be attributed to the development of automated reporting that is delivered to Deans, Academic Advisors, and Career Advisors on a weekly and/or monthly basis allowing staff to be more proactive about reaching out to students. The redesign of a more streamlined Graduation Survey format also contributed to this substantial improvement. It is important to note that when graduates fail to report their employment data, employment rates as reported in the annual *OSUIT Employment Report* are impacted.

Employment

Of the 554 completed surveys submitted, 554 provided employment data, or 100 percent of responses and 67.97 percent of 2023-2024 graduates. 65.73 percent of survey responses (47.21 percent of 2023-2024 graduates) stated they were already employed in some capacity, or they were actively engaged in employment contract negotiations. 16.97 percent were continuing their education at OSUIT or another institution. 1.62 percent were *not* seeking employment (Figure 1). When asked to explain why they were not seeking employment, 5 stated they were on an internship or continuing their education, See Appendix A to read the complete open-ended responses to "I am not seeking employment".

When employment data reported by our graduating students was disaggregated by highest degree earned (see Figure 2), BT degree earners had the *highest rate of employment* and the *lowest rate of seeking employment*. AAS had the *second highest rate of employment* and the *highest rate of seeking employment*, and AS had the *lowest rate of seeking employment*. Since the Graduation Survey is typically completed in the student's last semester at OSUIT graduates may not yet have a firm job offer. However, this statistic is now tracked with the addition of the response option *l am currently in employment contract/salary negotiations*. BT and AAS degree earners had the highest rates of students who were in employment negotiations, but AS degree earners were not far behind.

Only 19.51 percent of AS graduates planned to transfer to another college or university to continue their education. This is a substantial change from previous years and a decline of 19.55 percent from 2023. The most frequently reported institutions for transfer, by all survey respondents, were Oklahoma State University (OSU) – Stillwater and Northeastern State University (NSU).

Salary Data

Salary data for graduates reporting starting pay is listed in Figure 3 (see Appendix B for salary ranges). Although reported pay ranges indicate that some graduates were responding as part-time employees, the median pay range for 2023-2024 respondents was still between \$55,000 and \$59,999. This marks an increase in salary range from the previous year. 3.61 percent of respondents reported as below the poverty line, and 12.45 percent reported making at or above the real US median household

Unfortunately, students who report employment in one of the *employment* categories sometimes leave the employment details blank. In the past, respondents have cited employment requirements—such as signing a non-disclosure agreement—as the reason. However, direction by the US Department of Labor, The US Department of Education, the North Central Association of the Higher Learning Commission, and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education requires higher education institutions to report employment data, including salaries, for purposes of transparency and accountability. The OSUIT Graduation Survey is currently the most direct method at our disposal for collecting this information. 45.31 percent of survey responses provided employer information.

To meet federal and state requirements, the Graduation Survey data includes a confidentiality statement to the effect that all survey data, including employment data, is kept confidential. Student names are not listed with their employers, nor are salaries listed by employer. Salaries, as noted in Figure 3, are reported in ranges for an additional layer of privacy.

Survey Scales

Five scales (tables 3-8) utilizing a five-point Likert scale were used to determine levels of satisfaction among graduating students in areas of *Academics, Campus Services, Student Services*, General Feedback, and *Summary Items*:

1 = Highly Dissatisfied to 5 = Highly Satisfied or 1 = Strongly Disagree to 5 = Strongly Agree.

The Student Life Activities questions examine student engagement in sponsored extracurricular activities. Unlike the other scales, which report average scaled responses, the Student Life Engagement scale was characterized by a frequency distribution summarizing the accumulation of endorsements representing participation in the activities listed.

Satisfaction Questions

In the following charts and tables, the results for graduates of the most recent academic year are shown with frequencies for each item (response choice). Frequencies of *Not Applicable* and *No Answer* are included when appropriate. The results tables comparing the most recent five years show the weighted averages of responses for those five academic years. The weighted averages consider only the students who responded to an item; nonresponses and "not applicable" responses carry no weight and were excluded from the weighted averages. Dashboard views may require magnification to see additional details.

Satisfaction with Academic Program. Graduates in the current year reported higher levels of satisfaction in all areas compared to last year. Respondents reported the highest satisfaction with *Professionalism of instructors* (4.47) and *Quality of instructors in my major program of study* (4.42). Item *Advisement I received on career matters* (4.21) received lowest satisfaction rating although this is an increase from the rating in 2023.

Satisfaction with Campus Services. Graduates showed an increase in satisfaction with most campus services compared to last year. The highest satisfaction was reported for the *Covelle Hall-Wellness Center* (4.40). The next highest was *Post Office* (4.32). *Campus Housing* (3.72) had the lowest rating among the campus services for the fifth year in a row.

Satisfaction with Student Services. Student Services showed an increase in satisfaction in all areas compared to the previous year. The highest satisfaction ratings were reported for *Library Services* (4.50) with the second highest being the *LASSO Center* (4.41) for the second year in a row. The lowest ratings were reported for *Admissions/Recruitment* (4.26), although this is an increase from 2023.

Extracurricular Activities. Students do not rate these activities or events in terms of satisfaction, instead it is on self-reported participation. An increase in the number of online courses, internships, and resident/commuter status likely affect opportunities for participation. Reported frequency of participation in extracurricular activities decreased in all areas reported from the previous year. Two additional areas were added, and one was discontinued. The highest level of participation was *Free Food Events* (1.79), and *eSports* showed the least participation (1.37). This question has been redesigned for the 2024-2025 academic year.

General Feedback & Summary. Graduates reported they agreed more with the reported statements over the previous year. However, five of the eight items usually collected were either permanently or temporarily discontinued for this survey period. The item "OSUIT helped me gain the proper skills needed for my chosen career" showed the highest level of agreement for graduating students (4.21) followed by "OSUIT provided opportunities for hands-on experience in my chosen career field" (4.15). The item "OSUIT helped me build contacts with industry professionals" (3.86) had the lowest level of agreement, but saw an increase in agreement from 2023.

Survey Scale Analysis. The results for most of the satisfaction and agreement items were in line with results from the past four years with only slight changes that can partially be attributed to an increase in survey participation and modifications made to the survey itself.


Satisfaction with Academic Program (2023-2024 academic year)






Extracurricular Activities (2023-2024 academic year)










Appendix D: Response Detail by School: Satisfaction with Academic Program (2023-2024 academic year) Note: Blanks are excluded from calculations




Appendix E: Response Detail by School: Satisfaction with Campus Services (2023-2024 academic year) Note: Blanks are excluded from calculations






OSUIT Open-Ended Comment Sentiment Analysis


OSUIT Open-Ended Comment Thematic Analysis




