

# OSUIT Scholarships

All scholarships listed below require an application, essay, or a letter of recommendation as noted next to the scholarship name.

<b>Kirschner Endowment - Orphans 21 or Under*</b>	<p>Students who are a true orphan in the traditional sense or students from a single parent household are eligible. Both prospective and continuing OSUIT students seeking their first associate or bachelor degree are eligible. Applicants must have financial aid need as determined by a successful FAFSA. Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Students whose financial need has been met with other scholarships or grants may not receive a refund of these scholarship funds.</p> <p>*Must submit a KIRSCH scholarship application to the OSUIT Scholarship Coordinator by the published due date. <b>Kirschner Endowment-Handicapped*</b>	<p>A person who has physical and/or mental disabilities, included but not limited to, visual, hearing, dyslexia, attention deficit disorder, or autism is eligible to apply. Both prospective and continuing OSUIT students seeking their first associate or bachelor degree are eligible to apply. Applicants are NOT required to complete the FAFSA form. Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Students whose financial need has been met with other scholarships or grants may not receive a refund of these scholarship funds.</p> <p>*Must submit a KIRSCH scholarship application to the OSUIT Scholarship Coordinator by the published due date. <b>Kirschner Endowment-Orphans, No Age Restriction*</b>	<p>Students who are 22 years of age or older and are a true orphan in the traditional sense. Both prospective and continuing OSUIT students seeking their first Associates or Bachelor degree are eligible to apply. Applicants are NOT required to complete the FAFSA form. Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better.</p> <p>*Must submit a KIRSCH scholarship application to the OSUIT Scholarship Coordinator by the published due date. Applications are available by contacting the Scholarships Coordinator at <a href="mailto:scholarships@okstate.edu">scholarships@okstate.edu</a> or visit the Financial Aid Office in Grady Clack.</p>
<b>Martha Esther Dillman Memorial Scholarship*</b>	<p>Prospective or continuing students who graduated from Mounds or an Okmulgee county high school. Student who does not qualify for federal grants but still has a financial need as determined by a successfully completed FAFSA.</p> <p>*Must submit a scholarship application, essay, and letter of recommendation to the OSUIT Scholarship Coordinator by the published due date. Application and essay information is listed on the OSUIT scholarship website.</p>
<b>Mike Taylor Scholarship</b>	<p>Recipients must be enrolled as a full-time student at Oklahoma State University Institute of Technology. Annually, one award will be made to a student having a study focus of Construction Management Technology and one award will be made to a student studying Engineering Technology. Recipients of both awards must have successfully completed three semesters in the specified area of study, must have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale and must have documented financial need as determined by a successful FAFSA.</p> <p>*Must submit a scholarship application and essay to the OSUIT Scholarship Committee by the published due date. Application and essay information is listed on the OSUIT scholarship website.</p>
<b>ONEOK Engineering Technologies Scholarship</b>	<p>Recipients must be enrolled as students at Oklahoma State University Institute of Technology in the Engineering Technologies Division, in either the AAS in Electrical/Electronic or BT in Instrumentation Technology degree programs. Eligible students must meet one of the following criteria: a first-time college student must have graduated from high school and have a cumulative high school grade point average of at least 2.2 on a 4.0 scale; a student who has been home schooled, must have a GED and an ACT composite score of at least 21. If the student is a college transfer student, he/she must have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5. Financial need as demonstrated by FAFSA is not a requirement.</p> <p>*Must submit a scholarship application and essay to the OSUIT Scholarship Committee by the published due date. Application and essay information is listed on the OSUIT scholarship website.</p>
<b>OSUIT Family Fund Scholarship*</b>	<p>The recipient(s) must be enrolled as a regular degree-seeking student at OSUIT and must be a current or retired OSUIT employee, his/her spouse, child or grandchild. The recipient must re-apply each semester for scholarship consideration and must maintain a grade point average of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale to be considered for subsequent semesters.</p> <p>*Must submit a FAMILY scholarship application, to the OSUIT Scholarship Coordinator by the published due date. <b>OSUIT-Okmulgee Alumni Scholarship Fund</b>	<p>Preference will be given to students whose parents and/or grandparents are alumni of OSUIT. Both prospective and continuing students are eligible to apply and must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours. Cumulative 3.0 GPA or better is required.</p> <p>*Must submit an ALUMNI scholarship application to the OSUIT Scholarship Coordinator by the published due date.
