



# 2024-2025 Dependent Verification Worksheet

Your 2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for a review process called verification. The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you and your parents reported on your FAFSA. To verify that you provided the correct information, the financial aid administrator at your school will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You and at least one parent must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid administrator at your school. Your school may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact your financial aid administrator as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

The provided criteria for "dependent children" or "other persons" align with the requirement that family size align with whom the parent could claim as a dependent on a U.S. tax return if the parent were to file a U.S tax return at the time of completing the 2024-2025 FAFSA. As a result, the parent should not include any unborn children in the family size.

#### Verification of 2022 Income Information for Individuals with Unusual Circumstances

#### Individuals Granted a Filing Extension by the IRS

An individual who is required to file a 2022 IRS income tax return and has been granted a filing extension by the IRS beyond the automatic six-month extension for tax year 2022 must provide:

- A signed statement listing the sources of any 2022 income and the amount of income from each source.
- A copy of the IRS's approval of an extension beyond the automatic six-month extension for tax year 2022.
- A copy of IRS Form W–2 for each source of employment income received or an equivalent document for tax year 2022; and
- If self-employed, a signed statement certifying the amount of the individual's Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) and the U.S. income tax paid for tax year 2022.

#### Individuals Who Filed an Amended IRS Income Tax Return

An individual who filed an amended IRS income tax return for tax year 2022 must provide a signed copy of the 2022 IRS Form 1040X, "Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return," that was filed with the IRS or documentation from the IRS that includes the change(s) made by the IRS, in addition to one of the following:

- Updated income and tax information from the IRS on an ISIR record with all tax information from the original tax return:
- A 2022 IRS Tax Return Transcript (that will only include information from the original tax return and does not have to be signed), or any other IRS tax transcript(s) that includes all of the income and tax information required to be verified: or
- A signed copy of the 2022 IRS Form 1040 and the applicable schedules that were filed with the IRS.

#### **Individuals Who Were Victims of IRS Identity Theft**

An individual who was the victim of IRS tax-related identity theft must provide:

- A Tax Return DataBase View (TRDBV) transcript obtained from the IRS or, if unable to obtain a TRDBV, an equivalent
  document provided by the IRS or a copy of the signed 2022 income tax return and applicable schedules the individual
  filed with the IRS; and
- A statement signed and dated by the tax filer indicating that he or she was a victim of IRS tax-related identity theft
  and that the IRS is aware of the tax-related identity theft.

#### **Individuals Who Filed Non-IRS Income Tax Returns**

A tax filer who filed an income tax return with a tax authority other than the IRS may provide a signed copy of his or her income tax return that was filed with the relevant tax authority. However, if we question the accuracy of the information on the signed copy of the income tax return, the tax filer must provide us with a copy of the tax account information issued by the relevant tax authority before verification can be completed.

#### **Certification and Signatures**

Each person signing this worksheet certifies that all reported information is complete and correct. The student and one parent must sign.
