Key Points about Nursing:

- Until you are accepted to the nursing program, you will NOT be a nursing major and will be enrolled as an allied health science (or other applicable degree) major Advising is available for M-F from 8:00am to 12:00pm and 1:00pm to 4:00 pm, other times by appointment. Walk-ins are welcome or appointments can be made by calling 918-293-5337
- We strongly recommend students contact the nursing department prior to enrolling each semester—this allows us to review your plan of study, required courses and recommend nursing application dates.
- Students applying to the OSU Institute of Technology nursing program are selected based on a point system. **NO STUDENT IS GUARANTEED ADMISSION TO THE NURSING PROGRAM.**
- Once you are accepted to the nursing program and enrolled in nursing courses, you will be required to:
 - Supply and use a tablet device for lab and clinical—must be smaller than 8x11 and capable of running windows and/or the most updated IOS for Mac
 - Have computer and internet access at home

NURSING PROGRAM APPLICATION

Application to the nursing program and selection process must follow these steps:

1. Apply to OSUIT <https://admissions.osuit.edu/apply/>. This must be completed prior to testing. Once you have completed this process you will receive an acceptance letter from the college. This is separate and distinct from the nursing application.
2. If you have never been advised by the OSUIT nursing program, it is strongly recommended that you meet with a nursing advisor prior to submitting your nursing application.
3. Complete an online nursing program application. Nursing program applications can be found on the OSUIT website @ <https://admissions.osuit.edu/register/nursingapplication> or may be in the nursing department. This must be complete for EACH application period—it is not transferrable from one application period to another.
4. After receipt of your application, you will be contacted by the nursing department to schedule your ACCUPLACER. **You cannot take this test until you have completed both the online application to the college and the nursing program application.** Testing can be scheduled for on-campus or live proctoring via Zoom.
5. Testing information: The test is self-paced and not timed. You will be asked for photo identification for testing both on-campus and online. For on-campus testing, you will only be allowed to bring your keys and photo ID into the testing center. Students will be provided a piece of scratch paper and will use the on-screen calculator within the testing platform. **Please note, the on-screen calculator IS NOT available on most questions—students will be expected to complete the required calculations long-hand.** Additional testing procedures including rules/requirements for online testing will be provided upon scheduling.
6. To be eligible for the selection process students take the following sections and meet the minimum score:
 - Reading 250
 - Writing 250
 - Arithmetic 250
 - QASI (algebra)--no minimum score, for application points only
7. Test results will be sent directly to the nursing department by the Assessment Center; students will be given a copy of their results for their records.
8. Students are only allowed to test one time during the application period. Test results are valid for one calendar year—students with existing test scores may opt to retest on any or all sections of the ACCUPLACER and keep the highest of the two scores.
9. All official college transcripts from previously attended colleges must be on file in the nursing department with the original in the OSUIT Registrar's office. It is the student's responsibility to make sure that all of their college transcripts have been submitted to the college and the nursing department has access to them. **It is the nursing department's preference to have transcripts sent to nursing for nursing to copy and then forward originals to Admissions.**

A student will not be considered as a candidate for selection with a D or F in any required support courses on transcripts for current application period. Courses with a D or F must have been successfully repeated and posted to an official transcript to be eligible for admission to nursing.

LPNs ONLY

1. After receipt of your application, you will be contacted by the nursing department to schedule your KAPLAN FUNDAMENTALS CHALLENGE EXAM** which is given, in person, in the nursing department—there is no option for online Kaplan testing. The exam will be available multiple times throughout the application period.
2. To be eligible for the selection process, students must score at or above the 55th percentile ranking or higher on the Kaplan Fundamentals Challenge Exam.
3. Students are only allowed to test **one** time during the application period. Test results are valid for one calendar year—students with existing test scores may opt to retest and keep the highest score.

**Student will receive login information directly from Kaplan via email. This information CANNOT be retrieved by the OSUIT nursing department and is mandatory for testing. It is recommended the student arrive at least 15 minutes early. Please note the date/time of test when scheduled. No one is allowed in the testing room after the scheduled exam time begins. Students arriving late or without login information will not be allowed to test. Students cannot bring anything to the testing site except keys and photo ID. Please leave all bags, phones, purses, and other items in your vehicle. You will be provided with a calculator, scratch paper, and disposable ear plugs if requested.

The score for the Fundamentals challenge examination is scored as a percentile ranking this is not a percent. You will receive two scores on the Fundamentals Challenge examination and the score that is recorded is the percentile ranking.

ARTICULATION FOR LPN'S

Oklahoma State University Institute of Technology, a public two-year college accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, provides the opportunity for students who have completed a Practical Nursing Program and have an unencumbered nursing license in the state of Oklahoma to enter the OSUIT LPN-to-RN Program if they are selected.

LPN to RN Transition students become eligible for prior learning/advanced standing credit upon successful completion of NURS 1133 LPN to RN Transition and NURS 2129 Nursing Care of Adults I. This credit will substitute for the following 3 courses:

Students are charged a Prior Learning Evaluation/Advanced Standing Credit fee of \$5.00 per credit hour received

Upon earning a passing grade in NURS1133 LPN-to-RN Transition, the student will be eligible to enroll in NURS 2129 Nursing Care of Adults I, this course will be followed by NURS 2229 and NURS 2222.

Information for Bulletins and Catalogues
of Nursing Education Programs

- I. "The Oklahoma State University Institute of Technology nursing program is approved by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing. Graduates of this state-approved program are eligible to apply to write the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) for registered nurses. Applicants for Oklahoma licensure must meet all state and federal requirements to hold an Oklahoma license to practice nursing. In addition to completing a state-approved nursing education program that meets educational requirements and successfully passing the licensure examination, requirements include submission of an application for licensure, a criminal history records search, and evidence of citizenship or qualified alien status [59 O.S. §§567.5 & 567.6]. To be granted a license, an applicant must have the legal right to be in the United States (United States Code Chapter 8, Section 1621). In addition, Oklahoma law only allows a license to be issued to U.S. citizens, U.S. nationals, and legal permanent resident aliens. Other qualified aliens may be issued a temporary license that is valid until the expiration of their visa status, or if there is no expiration date, for one year. Applicants who are qualified aliens must present to the Board office, in person, valid documentary evidence of:
 1. A valid, unexpired immigrant or nonimmigrant visa status for admission into the United States;
 2. A pending or approved application for asylum in the United States;
 3. Admission into the United States in refugee status;
 4. A pending or approved application for temporary protected status in the United States;
 5. Approved deferred action status; or
 6. A pending application for adjustment of status to legal permanent resident status or conditional resident status.
- II. The Board has the authority to deny a license, recognition or certificate; issue a license, recognition or certificate with conditions and/or an administrative penalty; or to issue and otherwise discipline a license, recognition or certificate to an individual with a history of criminal background, disciplinary action on any professional or occupational license or certification, or judicial declaration of mental incompetence [59 O.S. §567.8]. These cases are considered on an individual basis at the time application for licensure is made, with the exception of felony convictions. Potential applicants to state-approved education programs, with a criminal history, may obtain an initial determination of eligibility for licensure or certification from the Oklahoma Board of Nursing for a fee. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

The following performance standards describe the nonacademic qualifications considered essential for successful admission and progression in the nursing program. These standards address the competencies expected of any nurse, the demands of nursing education and clinical training, and the welfare of patients who will entrust their health and safety to nursing graduates. The examples corresponding to each standard are not inclusive of all expected abilities.

Clinical Records

Upon acceptance to the nursing program, all students will be required to submit the following documentation to the nursing program:

1. Evidence of two MMR's (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) vaccines or a positive titer showing immunity to all three
2. Evidence of Hepatitis B series or positive titer showing immunity
3. Evidence of two Varicella vaccines or positive titer showing immunity
4. Evidence of TDaP booster
5. Evidence of Tuberculosis testing showing negative status and then annually thereafter. Tuberculin skin testing (TST) or blood testing (QuantIFERON Gold or T-SPOT) accepted
6. Evidence of Influenza vaccination (seasonal)
7. Current AHA BLS CPR certification, must include skills competency
8. Negative Federal Criminal Background check (sex-offender is included) **
9. Negative 10-panel urine Drug Screen – performed by a company designated by OSUIT nursing program; specific instructions will be provided to the student. **
10. Attestation of ability to meet the nursing program Performance Standards.

** if the certified background completed prior to admission shows a felony charge or registration on the sex offender registration list, or if initial drug screen is reported to the nursing program as positive, student will forfeit admission into the nursing program. LPN students who have a positive drug test will also be reported to the Oklahoma Board of Nursing. Any arrest while in the nursing program must be reported to the Director of Nursing immediately to determine continuing eligibility for clinical practice. Students who fail to report arrests while in the program will be subject to disciplinary action.

COVID-19 Vaccination Statement:

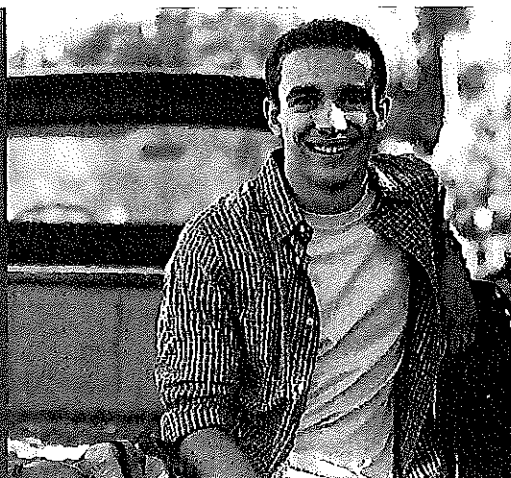
OSUIT is unable to mandate COVID-19 vaccinations of all students and employees due to recent legislation that was signed into law in May 2021. However, our clinical affiliation agreements state that students and faculty must follow hospital policy, which may include mandatory policies on COVID vaccinations.

At the time of publication, ALL facilities used for clinical placement have mandated completion of the initial COVID-19 vaccination series (1 or 2 dose depending on manufacturer).

Students who are not allowed to participate in assigned clinical experience for any reason, including declining a required COVID vaccination, will be unable to fulfill the requirements of the program and will not be able to fulfill the necessary requirements for graduation.
